

Communicating in the most effective ways doesn't come naturally for most of us. Motivational Interviewing (MI) is a particular way of talking with people about change and growth. MI provides tools to support individuals in exploring and resolving ambivalence and meet their goals.

MI Training Objectives include:

- Explain the meaning of the MI Spirit and general coaching approach to communication
- Ability to utilize key Motivational Interviewing Processes
- Improved ability to engage with intention using a minimum of one MI strategy
- Improved ability to engage and empower others in conversations when any behavior change is needed



Judith is an educator, trainer, consultant, and clinical supervisor. She is a co-founder and the lead trainer at the Synergetic Education® Institute. She is licensed as both a School and Professional Counselor and has worked at the intersection of education and mental health for over 25 years. Judith trains clinical and school-based mental health professionals and speaks and consults internationally on creating trauma-informed schools. As a District-Wide Social Emotional Learning Coach, Judith led her school district in implementing a "Thriving Schools Grant" aimed at advancing social-emotional wellness and behavioral health in school districts.

Judith created the Developmental Mindsets Paradigm,[™] a model for working with educators from a developmental perspective. She created and teaches frameworks such as Learning Tools[™] and Braindrops,[™] tools for developing interoceptive awareness and self-regulation. She's created programming that supports the implementation of regulatory-focused, social-emotional, trauma-informed practices for students and educators in schools worldwide.

Judith is a Registered Play Therapist Supervisor and is a Certified Synergetic Play Therapy® Supervisor and Teacher. She is a Parent Educator, Certified in EMDR Therapy, and is trained in Mindfulness in Education.

Nebraska VR (Vocational Rehabilitation) and the Nebraska Brain Injury Advisory Council (BIAC) are conducting a statewide brain injury needs assessment. As part of the project, three surveys are <u>available here</u>.


We are reaching out to all the Nebraska local health departments to encourage you to:

Complete the service provider survey. It can also be shared with other staff members or organizations who may want to provide input through the service provider survey.

Help promote the surveys for individuals with brain injury and family members/caregivers, using some of the suggestions below.

The feedback collected from the surveys will help identify service gaps and barriers as well as resource and training needs. It will also help the Nebraska VR and BIAC better understand the successes and challenges of those navigating life after a brain injury.

Nebraska's 2024 Brain Injury Needs Assessment



Take the survey(s) that apply to you and help Nebraska VR and the Brain Injury Advisory Council improve brain injury services and supports in our state. Survey results will be collected through Friday, April 12, 2024.

Individuals with Brain Injury Survey

This is for people in Nebraska who have experienced a brain injury. Although people can assist or fill out the survey on behalf of someone with a brain injury, the questions should be answered from the point of view of the person with the brain injury.

Family Members & Unpaid Caregivers Survey

This is for family members and unpaid caregivers and support persons of individuals living with a brain injury in Nebraska. This does not include personal attendants or other paid caregivers.

Service Provider Survey

This is for professionals who work for organizations or individuals (such as personal care attendants or paid caregivers) that provide services and support to individuals living with brain injury in Nebraska.
