Over 2,000 research studies have shown that hope is the #1 predictor of future well-being outcomes. Simply stated, high hope individuals are more likely to be healthier, happier in their jobs, and more fulfilled in life than their lower hope peers. Hope is easily defined, easily measured, and easily taught and practiced. In school settings, hope is a predictor of attendance, school engagement, achievement, and staff productivity. We will learn how to define hope and apply hope science to our own lives and to those around us.

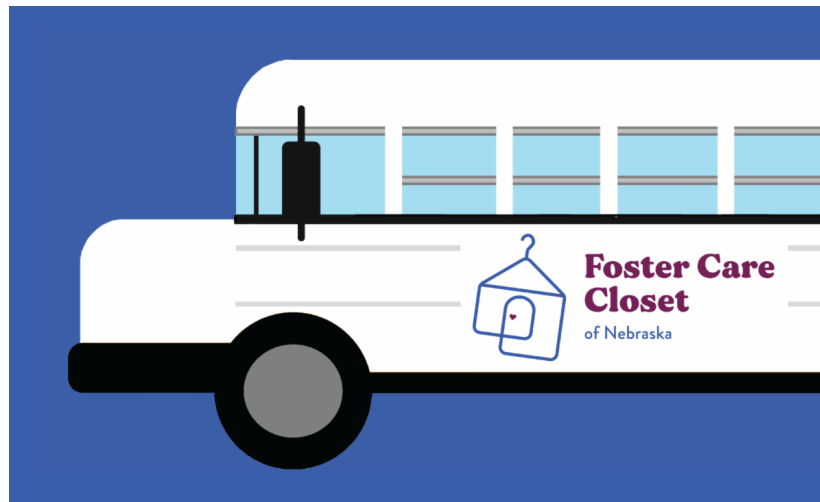

Crisis Stabilization Bidder's Conference Notice

Region 1 Behavioral Health Authority will be hosting a Bidder's Conference on September 28, 2023, at 1:00 p.m., located at the Region 1 Behavioral Health Authority office at 4110 Ave D Scottsbluff, NE 69361. This conference is being held in advance of the issuance of a Request for Proposals (RFP) seeking qualified, interested providers to develop and operate a Crisis Stabilization Unit. The program, Crisis Stabilization, that Region 1 plans to develop through this RFP process, would provide supportive services to individuals who are seeking behavioral health crisis services. The proposed program is intended to divert consumers in a crisis from unnecessary hospitalization and incarceration, while providing an opportunity to receive services in a safe, trauma-informed, and least restrictive setting, with the goals for the consumer to be able to stabilize, connect to resources, and safely return to the community. In addition to the service of Crisis Stabilization, it is the intent of Region 1 for additional services to be added such as Mental Health Respite, Crisis Response, and Medically Monitored/Social Detox.

Please note that attendance at the Bidder's Conference is mandatory for all providers if they plan to submit an RFP proposal, as well as to be considered in the RFP selection process. The RFP guidelines and all supporting documentation will be provided via email to all participants following completion of the Bidder's Conference.

THIS IS YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO OBTAIN YOUR U.S.
CITIZENSHIP!

REQUIREMENTS:

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Have been a green card holder for the past 5 years (or 3 years if married to a U.S. Citizen with whom you have been residing with for the past 3 years).
- Have had continuous residence and physical presence in the U.S.
- Naturalization eligibility will be determined during appointment.
- Ability to read, write, and speak basic English unless you are eligible for exemptions.
- Application fee is \$725, applicants may be eligible for a fee waiver.
- There is no fee to receive services from ILC.

LEARN HOW TO SUPPORT THE YOUNG PEOPLE IN YOUR LIFE

Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges among adolescents ages 12-18. You'll build skills and confidence you need to reach out and provide initial support to young people who are struggling. You'll also learn how to help connect them to appropriate support.

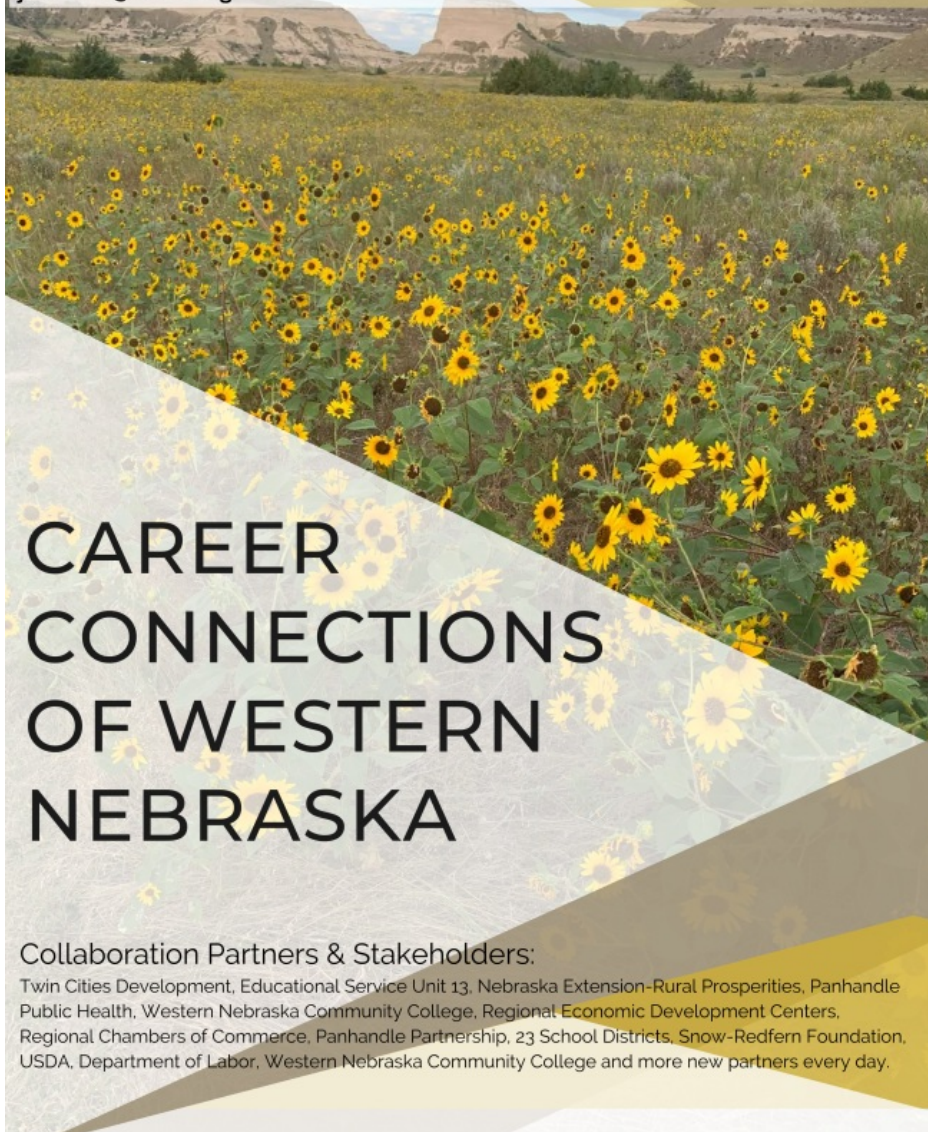
